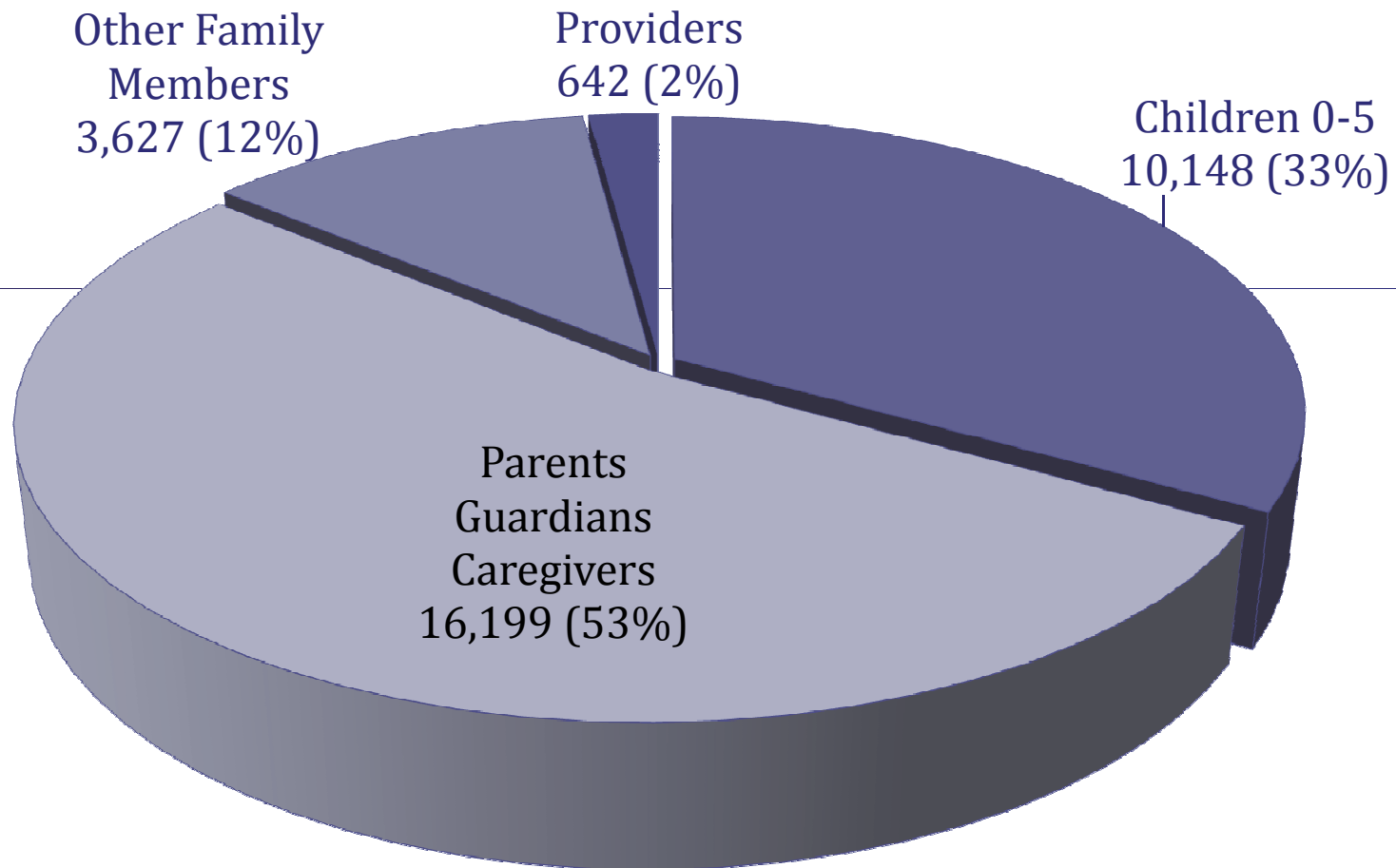

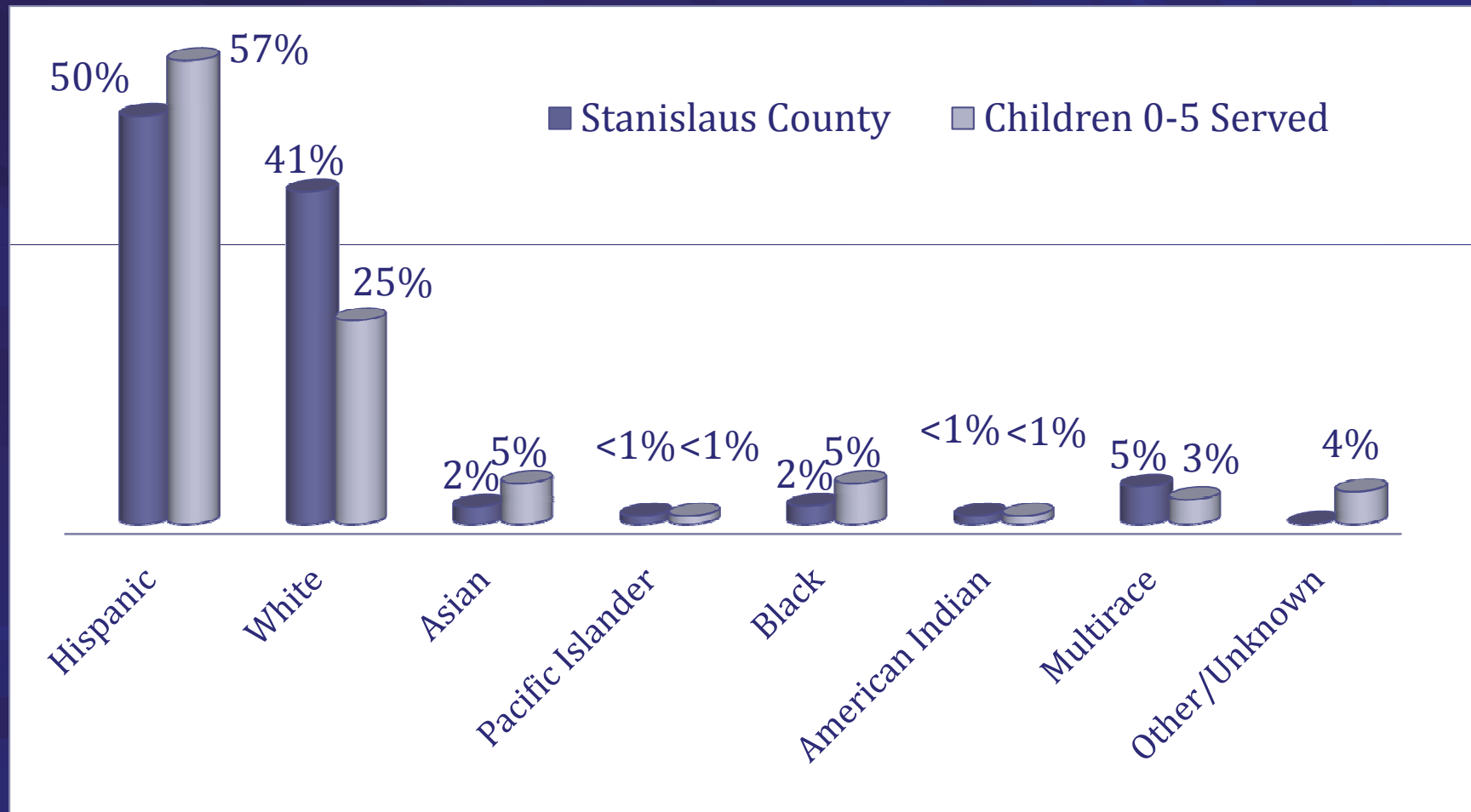

Total Participants By Type



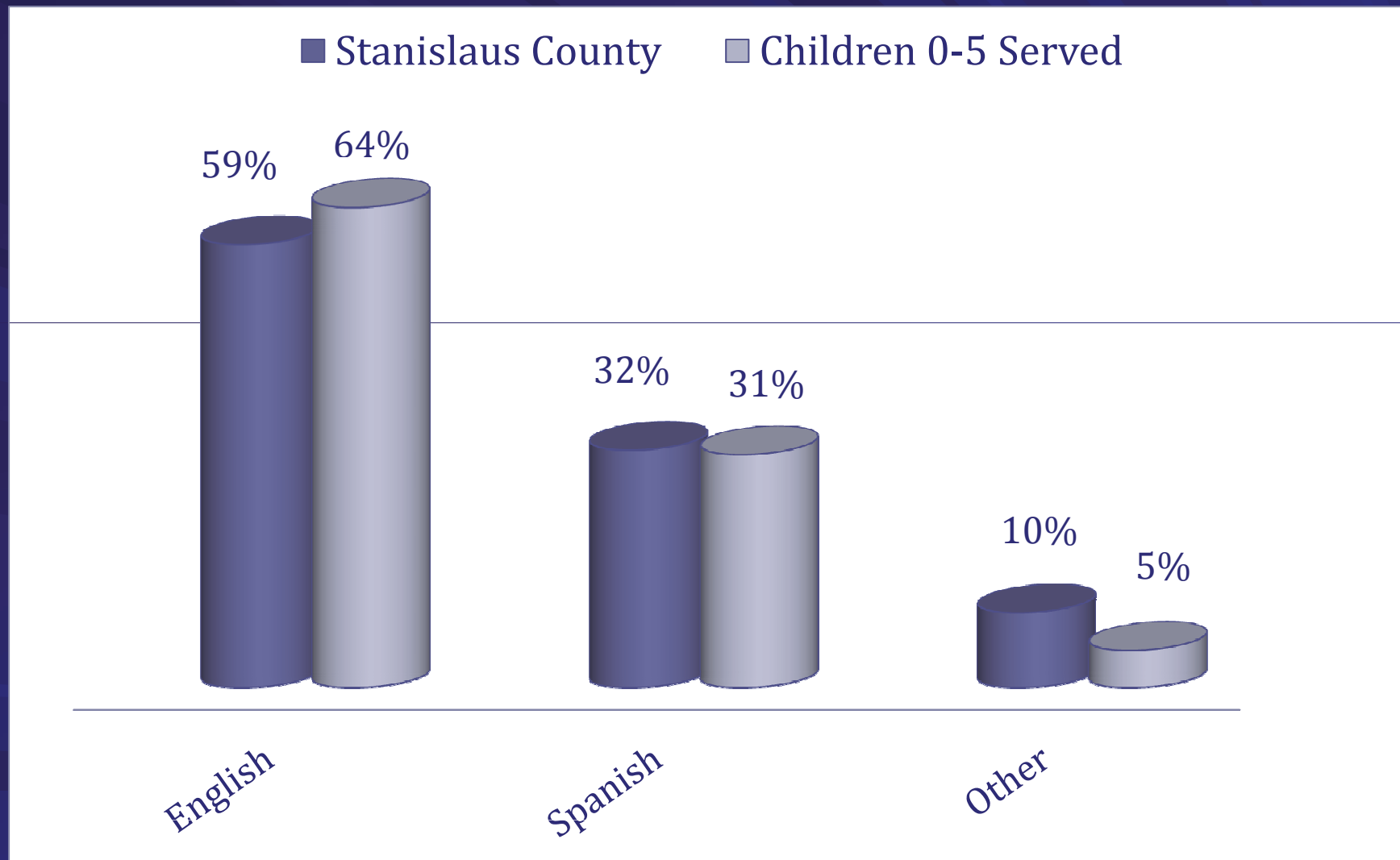

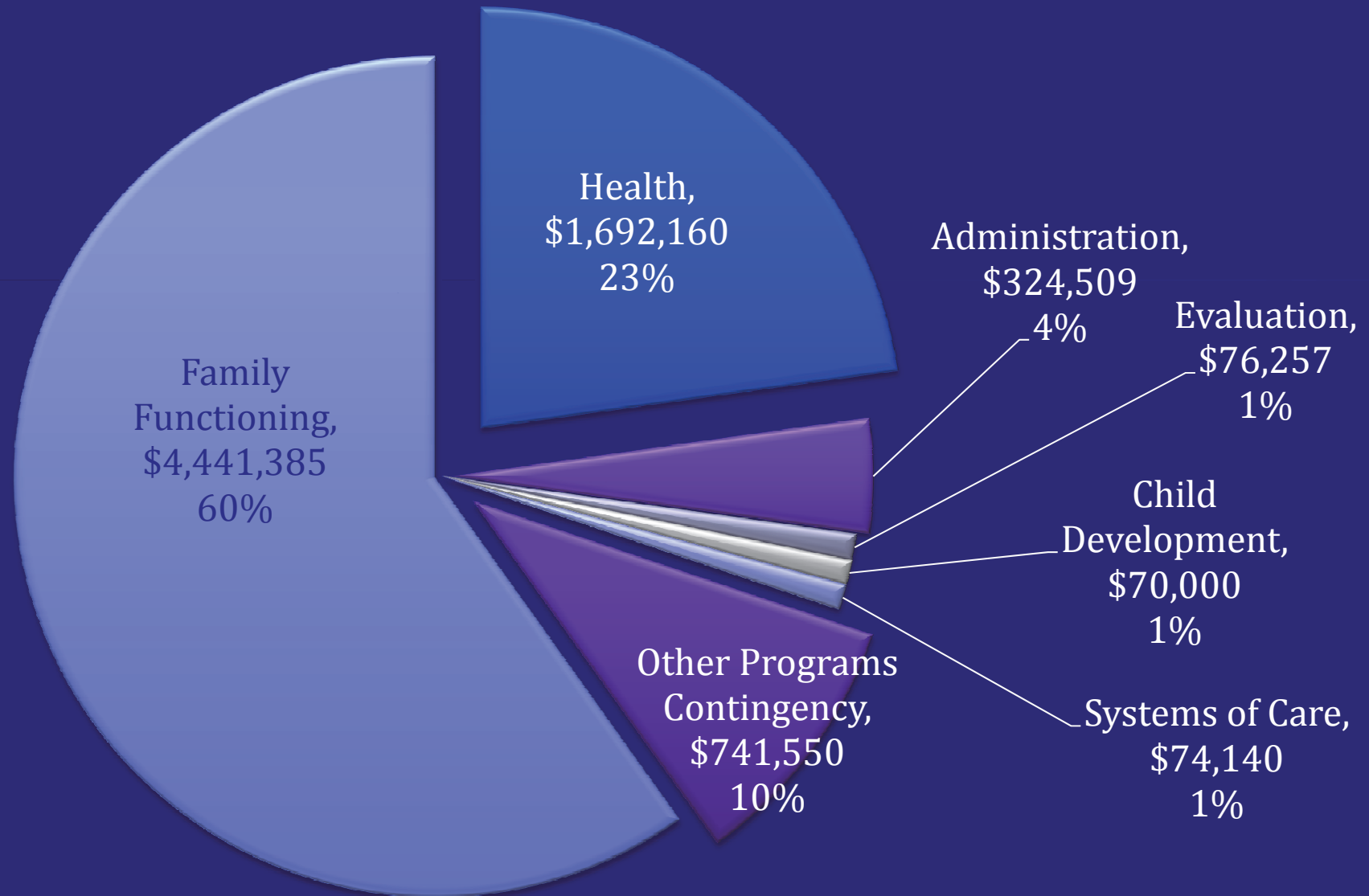
Language of Participants

Highlights

Families Are Going the Distance

- Parents of 8,999 children received family support services through countywide Family Resource Centers and other programs.
- 542 children received more intensive support services focused on improving child abuse factors.
- Parents of 1,218 children have increased parenting skills and knowledge after taking parenting classes.

Highlights

Taking Healthy Steps

- ❑ 609 children 0-5 and pregnant women who did not have access to health care received medical attention through an interim health care program.
- ❑ 514 pregnant women and children 0-5 who did not have health insurance are now enrolled in a health coverage plan.
- ❑ 141 infants were born healthy after their mothers participated in a healthy birth program and 80% of the moms initiated breastfeeding.

Highlights

In-Step with Education

- ❑ 687 families increased the time spent reading with their children at home after receiving literacy services.
- ❑ 129 children participated in the Kindergarten Transition program at schools sites across the county that helped prepare them for Kindergarten.
- ❑ 1,607 children 0-5 were screened for educational developmental issues and 390 were referred for further assessment or services.

Highlights

Leaving a Footprint Via Supportive Systems

- ❑ The families of 5,649 children have increased knowledge and utilization of community resources.
- ❑ Prop 10 funded programs brought in more than \$4.7M from other funding sources during fiscal year '12-'13, increasing the level of services for children and families.
- ❑ On average, Prop 10 funded programs collaborate with four or more other Prop 10 funded programs to decrease duplication and increase effectiveness of services.
