









Total Participants By Type



Ethnicity/Race Compared to Services







2014 - 2015 FY Budget



In the past decade...



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Supporting Families

- Parents of 10,809 children received family support services through countywide Family Resource Centers and other programs.
- 2,040 children received more intensive support services focused on improving child abuse risk factors.
- Parents of 1,284 children have increased parenting skills and knowledge after taking parenting classes.

All "highlights" data was reported by contractors

Safeguarding Children's Health

- 411 children 0-5 and pregnant women who did not have access to health care received medical attention through an interim health care program.
- 363 pregnant women and children 0-5 who did not have health insurance are now enrolled in a health coverage plan.
- 199 infants were born healthy after their mothers participated in a healthy birth program.
- Of 228 pregnant mothers who participated in a healthy birth program, 208 (91%) of them initiated breastfeeding.

Cultivating Futures Through Education

- 1,204 families increased the time spent reading with their children at home after receiving literacy services.
- 144 children participated in the Kindergarten Readiness program.
- 1,458 children 0-5 were screened for educational developmental issues and 286 were referred for further assessment or services.

Leading Via Supportive Systems

- The families of 6,790 children have increased knowledge and utilization of community resources.
- Prop 10 funded programs brought in more than \$7M from other funding sources during fiscal year '14-'15, increasing the level of services for children and families.
- Of that \$7 million, \$5 million came from funding sources outside of Stanislaus County.
