Any member of the audience desiring to address the Commission on a matter on the agenda, please raise your hand or step to the podium at the time the item is announced by the Commission Chairperson. In order that interested parties have an opportunity to speak, any person addressing the Commission will be limited to a maximum of 5 minutes unless the Chairperson of the Commission grants a longer period of time.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: Matters under the jurisdiction of the Commission, and not on the posted agenda, may be addressed by the general public either at the beginning of the regular agenda and any off-agenda matters before the Commission for consideration. However, California law prohibits the Commission from taking action on any matter which is not on the posted agenda unless it is determined to be an emergency by the Children and Families Commission. Any member of the public wishing to address the Commission during the "Public Comment" period shall be permitted to be heard once for up to 5 minutes.

These sections of law permit the Stanislaus County Children and Families Commission to execute contracts so long as the Commissioner(s) with the conflict recuses himself or herself from making, participating in making, or in any way attempting to use his or her official position to influence a decision on the contract.

1. Chair Harwell called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. Commission members, staff, and attendees were introduced and welcomed.

2. Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

- 3. Announcement of Commissioner Recusals Chair Harwell informed the audience that during the contract approval process there would be several recusals during discussions and votes on specific programs and recusals would be noted at that time.
- 4. Public Comment Period
 - Patricia Hill Thomas recognized David Jones for 20 years of employment with the County of Stanislaus.
- 5. Consent Calendar

The Consent Calendar was approved.

Motion by Skol, Second by Cooper. (8-0)(Chiesa out of the room during motion.)

- 6. Strategic Direction/Planning
 - Maggie Steakley (GPG) provided an agenda for Strategic Direction and Planning.
 - Steakley presented the final Strategic Plan and reviewed changes made to the document based on feedback she received from Commissioners during the prior meeting and the Commissioner survey.
- 7. Agenda Items
 - A. Conducted a public hearing to consider the adoption of the First 5 Stanislaus Strategic Plan 2019-2024 prepared by The Glen Price Group, and adopted the Strategic Plan 2019-2024.

The Public Hearing on the Plan was opened at 4:38 p.m. by Chair Harwell. Susan Beasley thanked the Commission for being inclusive and transparent during the strategpic direction and planning process. David Jones recognized Maggie and the Glen Price Group for their work; he thanked Commissioners for the time, energy and passion they invested into the strategic planning process. Commissioner Harwell thanked the steering committee for the extra time and work they put into the strategic planning process. The Public Hearing was closed at 4:46 p.m.

The Commission accepted the Strategic Plan 2019-2024. *Motion by Parades-Walsborn, Second by Cantu. (9-0)*
